How to Host a House Screening

- 1. Set a date and time.** Pick a time that will work for you, your family, and the people you are planning to invite. The video is only 35 minutes long, so you could meet for as little as an hour, or make your screening part of a longer social event.
- 2. Send the invitations.** Whether by phone, email, or cards in the mail, let folks know what you're planning, and encourage them to come.
- 3. Prepare to make your guests comfortable.** At a minimum, you want to be sure your guests will have places to sit and something to drink. But go all out if you want to. Is it time to break out the grill? Order in pizza? Whatever food and other entertainment you provide is up to you!
- 4. Secure the *Overruled* video.** Since it is available online absolutely free, this can be as simple as going to OverruledMovie.com and letting the video buffer enough to play smoothly. Or you might use a video program to record the video to your hard drive so when it's showtime you can just click "Play."
- 5. Prepare for Support.** *Overruled* is designed to inspire new support for the Parental Rights Amendment. You can either set up a computer for your guests to visit OverruledMovie.com and take action right after the film, or you can print out a petition from ParentalRights.org/petition, and collect signatures during your event.
- 6. Host the event.** The guests arrive, the food is prepared, and the movie is cued up. Just click "play," and enjoy the time with your friends while opening their eyes to the current state of American parental rights.
- 7. Enlist new supporters.** When the video is done, your friends will be ready to take action. That's when you point them to the website to sign the petition, or you ask them to complete a ParentalRights.org petition. If you get petition signatures, simply write "Overruled" at the top and mail petitions to ParentalRights.org, PO Box 1090, Purcellville, VA 20134. Those who sign up will be added to the ParentalRights.org email list so we can keep them up-to-date on how to take action, but their information will not be rented or sold, and they can cancel at any time.
